18 Now comes the Defendants, Moses Onciu, pursuant to Rule 29 (c)(1). United States Code, Rules
19 of Criminal Procedure, and moves this court for a judgment of acquittal after a guilty verdict, and in
20 support thereof, states the following grounds:


- 21 1. The court erred in not granting the motion for acquittal on all counts after the government
- 22 reseted its case.
- 23 2. The court erred in not granting the motion for acquittal at the end of all the evidence.
- 24 3. The court erred by not giving Disputed Instruction number 3 regarding the existence of two
- 25 conspiracies and the necessity of the jury determining which conspiracy existed, if at all, and the one to
- 26 which the defendant belonged, if at all.
- 27 5. The court erred by not giving Disputed Instruction number 4 which limited the effect of
- 28 testimony regarding the defendant's conversations with Agent Moore in January and February, 1908.

RULE 29(c) MOTION FOR JUDGMENT OF ACQUITTAL

1 Wherefore, for the foregoing reasons, Defendant moves this court for an order entering a
2 judgment of acquittal, or in the alternative, granting him a new trial.
