19	As stated in the United States' previous Motions to Strike <sup>1</sup> , the Motion for Prope	
20	Procedure was improperly filed on DLP LT 13 Trust's behalf by Trustee Elmer P. Vild.

1 Mr. Vild is not an attorney and is not authorized to represent parties other than himself, 2 and the Motion for Proper Procedure should be stricken from the record. See, e.g., Simon 3 v. Hartford Life, Inc., 546 F.3d 661, 664-65 (9th Cir. 2008). 4 The Motion itself also has no basis in law, and appears to be yet another Motion 5 to Dismiss. See Mot. to Dismiss (Doc. No. 24); Sec. Mot. to Dismiss (Doc. No. 37); Third 6 Mot. to Dismiss (Doc. No. 38). Furthermore, the Jurisdiction Challenge (Doc. No. 25)<sup>2</sup> 7 referred to by Trustee Elmer P. Vild was improperly filed by him on behalf of DLP LT 8 13 Trust, and should also be stricken from the record. 9 In addition, the Jurisdiction Challenge failed to articulate any meaningful 10 challenge to the jurisdictional basis for this case, clearly set forth as required in both the 11 Complaint and the Amended Complaint.<sup>3</sup> See Compl. ¶¶2-3; Am.
