22	a fair reading of it tells the jury that it is a <b>fact</b> that defendant did not feel obligated to file tax		
23 24	returns. Of course, the United States disputes this and will produce evidence that proves that it

26	It appears that the Court's intention is to ascertain if any potential juror is predisposed to		
27	convict because the juror filed returns and the evidence may show that Taylor did not. We		
28	suggest that the point which needs to be made here is that non-filing alone is not sufficient for		
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conviction; there are additional elements to each of the offenses charged. The United States has
no objection to the Court so informing the jurors or, for that matter, telling them the definition
of willfulness.
