On June 13, 2011, the Court granted	d Mrs. Parker's motion to sever her trial
from her husband's. (ECF Doc. 88) At th	e time, the Court expected that Mrs.
Parker's trial would begin upon the comp	oletion of Mr. Parker's trial. The Court
set Mr. Parker's trial for November 1, 201	1. On August 29, 2011, the Court
continued that trial date for Mr. Parker, setting a new trial date of May 29, 2012.	

(ECF Doc. 103) Mrs. Parker then filed a motion to continue her November 28, 2011 trial, to begin after her husband's trial concluded. (ECF Doc. 104) On September 6, 2011, the Court granted Mrs. Parker's motion and set her trial for July 17, 2012. (ECF Doc. 105). While the Court has held a status conference for Mr. Parker's trial setting (ECF Doc. 113) and has set a pretrial hearing for May 16, 2012 for Mr. Parker, the Court and the Parties in Mrs. Parker's case have not yet had such hearings. Mrs. Parker's next hearing before this Court is a final pretrial conference, set for July 13, 2012. (ECF Doc. 105)

At the April 2, 2012 status conference for Mr. Parker (ECF Doc. 113), the Government and Mr. Parker's lawyers tried to estimate the length of Mr. Parker's trial. As Counsel understood the discussion, Mr. Parker's trial is expected to last several weeks. That estimate is consistent with the more than 500 exhibits the Government has listed for use in Mr. Parker's trial. The Court noted that during some of those weeks, the Court may not have four trial days available for trial.

Mr. Parker's trial length, therefore, is difficult determine at this time. It is possible that it may continue past the July 17, 2012 trial setting in Mrs. Parker's case. Therefore, Mrs. Parker's Counsel is at a significant disadvantage at this time. For example, Counsel cannot accurately tell when she will start Mrs. Parker's trial, how long she can expect to be in trial, and when she should tell any witnesses to plan to be available for testimony.

Moreover, other than settlement discussions that Mrs. Parker would not describe as formal plea offers from the Government, the Government and Mrs. Parker have had little communication about what Mrs. Parker's trial will be – the witnesses the Government will call, the exhibits it will use, and even the length of the trial. Mrs. Parker's Defense cannot assume that the Government's case against her will mirror her husband's trial. Mr. Parker's trial involves complex international business transactions and transfers between trusts and limited liability corporations. The Government has not suggested – at least that Counsel can determine — that Mrs. Parker was involved in any of that business. Rather, it insists that she knowingly violated the law when she signed two offers in compromise, prepared by Mr. Parker's prior lawyer.

The Government's focus on preparing for Mr. Parker's imminent trial in lieu of Mrs. Parker's matter, which is set eight weeks away, is understandable. As of the filing of this Motion, however, Counsel for Mrs. Parker has been given little from the Government that allows the Defense to gauge the length of Mrs. Parker's trial or to begin reviewing the Government's proposed exhibits that will be proffered against her. Counsel cannot expect that once Mr. Parker's lengthy, complicated trial begins, the Government will be able to drop what it is doing in that case and focus on Mrs. Parker's trial.

Mr. Parker's case is set for a final pretrial conference on May 16, 2012.

(ECF 126) Some of Counsel's concerns about Mr. Parker's trial overtaking Mrs.

1	Parker's July 17, 2012 trial setting may be resolved at that hearing. Mrs. Parker
2	files this Motion in an exercise of caution and to allow the Parties to begin
3	discussing Mrs. Parker's trial setting in the context of the anticipated length of
4	her husband's trial. Counsel suggests a 45-day continuance, to allow for the
5	scheduling issues presented by Mr. Parker's trial and for the Parties to properly
6	
7	prepare for Mrs. Parker's trial.
8	The Government objects to this Motion.
9	The Court will find attached a proposed Order.
