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MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES INTRODUCTION

2	INTRODUCTION	
3	On December 15, 2016, the Magistrate Judge filed and served her Report and	
4	Recommendation, detailing the various procedural and substantive defects in the	
5	Plaintiffs' First Amended Complaint (FAC) and recommending dismissal of the	
6	FAC with leave to amend. Rather than attempt to cure these numerous defects,	
7	Plaintiffs filed their unnoticed motion for the Honorable Stephen V. Wilson to	
8	recuse himself "due to the obvious direction this case is headed in the district	
9	court." Pls.' Mtn. 5, ECF No. 126. Plaintiffs offer scant and unsupported	
10	allegations to justify this overt attempt at forum-shopping and waste of judicial	
11	resources. Accordingly, the State Defendants respectfully request that the Court	
12	deny Plaintiffs' Motion to Recuse Judge Wilson.	
13	ARGUMENT	
14	The federal recusal statute, 28 U.S.C. § 455, prescribes specific	
15	circumstances in which a judge shall be recused. 28 U.S.C. § 455 (2016). The	
16	procedure in which a party shall move to recuse a judge is set forth in 28 U.S.C. §	
17	144. 28 U.S.C. § 144 (2016).	
18	Procedurally, the moving party shall file a "timely and sufficient affidavit	
19	stat[ing] the facts and the reasons for the belief that bias or prejudice exists not	
20	less than ten days before the beginning of the term at which the proceeding is to be	
21	heard, or good cause shall be shown for failure to file it within such time." 28	
22	U.S.C. § 144 (2016). Plaintiffs have failed to file such an affidavit. Plaintiffs'	
23	Motion to Recuse is also untimely, because the hearing on Defendants' Motion to	
24	Dismiss Plaintiffs' FAC took place on December 13, 2016.	
25	Even if the Court overlooks these procedural deficiencies and finds good	
26	cause for the thirty-seven day delay in filing, Plaintiffs still fail to allege any facts	
27	to support a motion to recuse Judge Wilson. "The standard for recusal is whether a	
28	reasonable person with knowledge of all the facts would conclude that the judge's	

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impartiality might reasonably be questioned." Mayes v. Leipziger, 729 F.2d 605,		
607 (9th Cir. 1984). Plaintiffs contend that Judge Wilson has "a bias and prejudice		
towards Middleton, a Pro Se litigation and the defendants who are city and or		
county officials." Pls.' Mtn. 2, ECF No. 126. ¹		
The sole support that Plaintiffs offer is a conclusory, self-serving and		
unsupported statement that Judge Wilson "applied the wrong legal standard for		
dismissal of" Middleton's three previous cases against Santa Barbara police officers		
and prosecutors. Pls.' Mtn. 2, ECF No. 126. Yet, no details or explanations are		
given to verify or justify this statement. "The alleged prejudice must result from an		
extrajudicial source; a judge's prior adverse ruling is not sufficient cause for		
recusal." United States v. Studley, 783 F.2d 934, 939 (9th Cir. 1986).		
Plaintiffs have failed to demonstrate that Judge Wilson has acted with bias or		
prejudice against Plaintiffs.		
CONCLUSION		
Accordingly, Defendants respectfully request that Plaintiffs' Motion to		
Recuse Judge Wilson be denied.
