13 John Stuart, Real Party in
14 Interest/Third Party Intervener
having All Rights

15 Third Party Intervener appears^① and petitions, in the nature of a
16 motion, ① to Notify the World Court of crimes

17 against Humanity committed at the 4th Ave. jail.

18 WHEREAS, untried and thus unconvicted

19 people are civilians and not "convicts"; and

20 WHEREAS, CO₂ is a poisonous gas; and

21 WHEREAS, science has established recognized

22 guidelines and formulas pertaining to the number

23 of human beings that may be contained in a

24 given space and such guidelines are violated at 4th Ave; and

25 WHEREAS, the WORLD COURT in accordance

with and pursuant to several Treaties with

1 the United States, which is inclusive of
2 Arizona, and other countries; and
3 WHEREAS said Treaties prohibit the use
4 of poisonous gas against civilians; and
5 WHEREAS said Treaties prohibit the
6 starvation and/or purposeful malnutrition
7 of prisoners and thus require that said
8 prisoners be fed every 5¹/₂ hours or less
9 during waking hours with edible food; and
10 WHEREAS said Treaties prohibit the torture
11 of civilians; and
12 WHEREAS the United States constitution,
13 specifically the 8th Amendment, prohibits
14 unusual punishment, which is inclusive of all forms of
15 torture; and
16 WHEREAS starvation and/or malnutrition are
17 forms of torture; and
18 WHEREAS CO₂ poisoning is a form of torture
19 and similar in nature to strangulation and/or
20 water boarding; and
21 WHEREAS the chaining of civilians not yet
22 tried nor convicted of any crime is a form
23 of psychological torture; and
24 WHEREAS the long term confinement of a
25 civilian in a small space is a form of psychological
torture; and

1 WHEREAS, the 4th Ave. jail operating in
2 MARICOPA COUNTY and under the guidance and
3 control of the office of Sheriff Arpaio
4 uses the aforementioned tortures in
5 violation of the aforementioned laws
6 and Treaties; and

7 WHEREAS the Sheriff Arpaio, the Detention
8 Officers, the Deputies, the Prosecutors, the
9 Judges and any and all other officers of the
10 court and jails in MARICOPA COUNTY are
11 well aware of all the aforementioned acts
12 of torture; and

13 WHEREAS aforementioned officers and
14 such participate and/or have failed to
15 notify the proper authorities of such
16 unlawful acts, are thus either direct
17 participants in said crimes and/or conspirators
18 with and/or accessories to the criminals
19 and/or primes and are as culpable as those
20 that actually cause the physical and
21 psychological torture; and

22 WHEREAS the failure to report said
23 crimes to the proper officials is in itself
24 a federal and international crime under the
25 laws and treaties; and

1 WHEREAS, the 4th Ave jail as its normal
2 operating procedures, does:

3 i) gas civilians by confining large numbers
4 of them, standing almost shoulder to shoulder,
5 in sealed rooms with a grossly inadequate
6 air supply;

7 a) to torture in a manner similar to strangulation; and
8 b) to confuse said civilians and impair their
9 cognitive abilities in order to easily trick
10 said civilians into signing confessions and/or
11 plea agreements; *

12 *Use of torture, threats, coercion, gassing and
13 the like by the jail for the prosecution
14 invalidates all agreements and confessions.

15 ii) starve civilians by offering only two (2)
16 meals per day, neither of which is
17 acceptable for human consumption and
18 the meals themselves are a form of psychological
19 torture by humiliation as evidenced by
20 reported comments of Sheriff Arpaio.
21 Food from said meals may not be stored
22 by the civilian prisoners, thus the
23 civilians are only fed once every
24 twelve (12) hours; and

25 iii) civilians are held in a 6' x 12' cell for
sixteen (16) hours per day, every day.

1 This form of torture is both physical and
2 psychological and due to its continuous
3 and repetitive nature will almost always
4 lead to a form of post traumatic stress
5 disorder (PTSD) as described in the

6 DSM 4. The use of this torture may very
7 likely have permanent and irreversible
8 psychological effects on the innocent
9 civilian population being tortured this
10 way by Sheriff Arpaio, as has been
11 discovered in studies on prisoners of
12 war that experienced similar long term
13 small area confinement.

14 SHERIFF ARPAIO IS USING THIS
15 FORM OF TORTURE, WITH MALICE
16 AFORETHOUGHT, TO TURN THE
17 INNOCENT CIVILIAN PRISONERS
18 INTO HIS FUTURE CRIMINAL
19 POPULATION TO ENSURE THE
20 CONTINUED PROFITABILITY OF THE
21 JAIL.

22 THIS IS A HEINOUS AND VIOLENT
23 ACT AGAINST THE HUMAN RACE
24 AS A WHOLE AND RISES TO THE
25 LEVEL OF A CRIME AGAINST
HUMANITY.

"PIRATA EST HOSTIS HUMANI GENERIS"

1 WHEREAS, it is a founding principle of our society
2 and our judicial system that all people are
3 "innocent until proven guilty." Thus, the concept
4 of treating people that have yet to be
5 tried and may possibly never be convicted as
6 any crime as convicted criminals and as
7 dangerous wild animals by chaining and caging
8 them is reprehensible and an insult to
9 the very principals of this country. The
10 treatment of the civilians in custody
11 at the 4th Ave jail is horrendous. Even
12 a few days of such treatment will leave
13 permanent irreversible effects on almost
14 all who are subjected to it. Sheriff Arpaio's
15 NAZI like experiment an Arizona society
16 to see if he can convert innocent people
17 into future criminals will most likely be
18 a success as few innocent people will
19 have the emotional and psychological
20 strength to endure Arpaio's torture
21 techniques without succumbing to its
22 internal rage. Arpaio is attempting to
23 instill in the innocent members of the
24 jailed population.

25 Note: the use of poisonous gas against civilian
population is also an act of WAR and
a WAR CRIME.

1 Definitions per Black's Law Sixth Edition

2 Civilian: Private citizen as distinguished from
3 P. 246 such as belong to the armed services.

4 Convict: One who has been ADJUDGED GUILTY
5 P. 333 of a criminal charge and is serving a
6 sentence as a result of such conviction.

7 War Crimes: Crimes committed by countries in
8 p. 1583 violation of the international laws
9 governing wars.

10 Torture: To inflict intense pain to body or mind
11 p. 1490 for purposes of punishment, or to
12 EXTRACT A CONFESSION or information,
13 or for SADISTIC PLEASURE.

14 Poison: A substance having an inherent
15 p. 156 deleterious property, which renders it,
16 when taken into the system, capable
17 of destroying life.

18 Pirate: One guilty of the crime of piracy.

19 Piracy: Those acts of robbery and depredation
20 p. 1148 upon the high seas [Admiralty law inclusive
21 of acts on land when applied.] which, if
22 committed on land would have amounted
23 to a felony... shall be imprisoned for
24 life. sec: 18 U.S.C.A. § 1651

2 War Crime: crimes committed against an enemy,
3 p. 2142 prisoners of war, or subject in war-
4 time that violate international
5 agreements OR, as in the case of genocide,
6 are offenses against humanity.

7 Humanity: All human beings collectively, the
8 p. 931 human race, humankind.

9 Poison gas: ANY of various toxic gases, esp. those
10 p. 1495 used in chemical warfare to kill or
11 incapacitate on inhalation or contact

1 THEREFORE, John Stuart, a man, unlawfully
2 imprisoned by criminal acts of a Pirate, as
3 defined by 18 USC § 1651, known as Charbel
4 who is impersonating a prosecutor in violation
5 of her oath of office, and is in violation of
6 her oath of office, moves and compels
7 this court, in the interest of justice
8 and human rights, in accordance with
9 various Treaties and the requirements
10 thereof to report said human rights
11 violations, to report said crimes and
12 unlawful acts to the WORLD COURT
13 forthwith. Failure of the court and/or
14 its officers to make said report is in
15 itself a violation of federal and international
16 law.

18 John Stuart, the man, a witness and victim of all
19 previous mentioned torture, HEREBY ACCUSES
20 SHERIFF JOE ARPAIO and PROSECUTOR
21 SUSIE CHARBEL and JUDGE ROLLAND STEINLE
22 and County Attorney ANDREW THOMAS of
23 the aforementioned crimes of torture and other
24 crimes against humanity, and John Stuart
25 HEREBY COMMANDS the court to convene a grand
jury for John Stuart to present evidence and


1 begin the investigative procedure for possible
2 indictments against said parties, et al.

5 FURTHERMORE, John Stewart, the man, is unlawfully
6 imprisoned by Pres. Charbel and in the custody
7 of Arpaio, Thomas and Steinle and is in fear
8 for his life as several people who have
9 filed charges against Arpaio have mysteriously
10 died and/or been unlawfully imprisoned
11 indefinitely.

13 IN ADDITION, pursuant to A.R.S. OF VICTIM'S
14 RIGHTS it is unlawful and reprehensible
15 for the court to allow the very criminals
16 committing heinous acts against Stewart, and
17 that Stewart is witnessing against and
18 accusing, to be allowed to continue
19 detaining and torturing Stewart.

22 RIGHTS AND DECENCY John Stewart, the man
23 MUST BE RELEASED FROM CUSTODY.

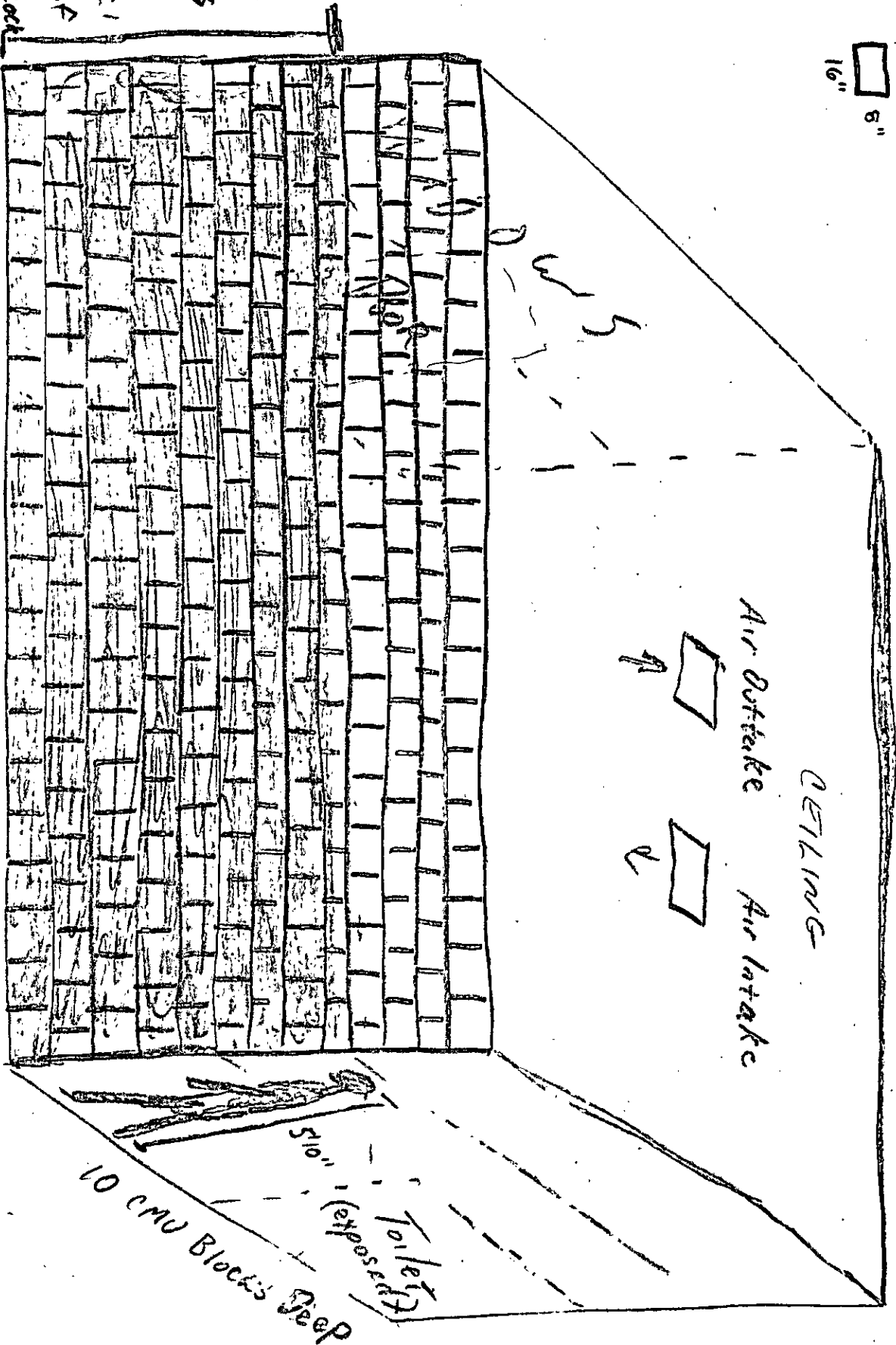

Total space = 3080 cubic feet

1 man = approx. 18 cubic feet

92 men = approx. 1730 cubic feet

Actual breathable air space = 1350 cubic feet

Air needed for 1 man for 12 hours = 1000 cf

Air in room for 1 man = less than 20 hrs

Air in room for 100 men = .2 hrs or 12 min

Extrapolation:

There was less than 20 minutes of good air in the room for the 92 men being held in said room. 92 men were held in the room for over 90 minutes, approx. 5 times as the supply of good air allowed. Said air supply would have definitely reached greater than the 10% CO₂ concentration. Thus, everyone placed in that room that morning was tortured and permanently physically and psychologically injured.

Data for Drawings

All figures and math and data is approximate.

Scientific data is verifiable.

Data supplied by witness, Stuart, is verifiable through the jail's video system. It must be noted that said video system has a tendency to be inoperative on the days that requested histories have been subpoenaed.

CO₂ levels > 1% good > 3% safe

5-10% dangerous above 10% lethal


